## SEVENTH GRADE BOOK CLUB- *WARRIORS DON'T CRY*

The seventh grade book club just finished a very powerful book titled *Warriors Don't Cry* by Melba Pattillo Beals. This story is an account of The Little Rock Nine. The students were very engaged reading this and discussing the hardships that these students encountered. At the end of the book, the book club was encouraged to write a persuasive essay on the subject of racism.

Esther Marshall, a seventh grade book club student, wrote, "There are bad effects about racism. Racism can make a victim get hurt, angry or upset. The racist comments can destroy the victim's self-esteem. Racism can destroy communities and create barriers within society." Esther went on to say that Melba felt this very way while making the decision to enter an all-white high school.

Another seventh grade student, Tim Gonakis, would like to see racism end because "It brings people apart, and people will start to act violently...Even families can be divided by racism."

Our next book, for the seventh grade book club will be *Wringer* by Jerry Spinelli.
